OUR STORY

Since the late 1980s a group of current and former railway employees have been collecting railway heritage items. In 2008, this group of Riverina railway enthusiasts formed the Wagga Wagga Rail Heritage Association with the aims of conserving the rail heritage of the Wagga Wagga district and developing a rail museum.

Today the Wagga Wagga Rail Heritage Museum houses over 500 historic railway items from catering and stationary equipment through to communication devices and mechanical items. The Museum's volunteer workforce provides a wealth of information to tour groups and visitors about the rich history of rail in the Riverina.



The Museum is located in the Porter's Room at the Wagga Wagga Railway Station. Built in the grand Victorian style, Wagga Wagga Railway Station was opened in 1879. It was designed by John Whitton, who is affectionately known as the 'Father of the N.S.W. Railways'.
